eyond our well-established reputation of completing major tunnelling projects in Malaysia, there's a lesser-known story that truly defines our expertise. Picture this: our first step into the realm of tunnelling excellence unfolded on the international stage, where we secured a triumph in Taiwan's Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) project in Kaohsiung.

This moment marked the beginning of our journey to become trusted experts in the intricate world of tunnelling, echoing the wisdom of Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu, who stated, "The journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step."

This timeless wisdom and the key to Gamuda's success in Taiwan lies in two essential principles: *Guān Xì* (关系 – meaning relationship) and *Jiān Chi* (坚持 – representing perseverance).

These fundamental values, deeply rooted in Chinese business culture, including the unwavering spirit of team perseverance, have opened doors for new business partnerships and have also been instrumental in paving the way for our Group's historic entry into Taiwan.

The first chapter of our remarkable journey unfolded in 2002, guided by the visionary leadership and foresight of Dato' Ir Ha Tiing Tai,

affectionately known as Dato' Paul Ha, deputy group managing director when we won the Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) project in Kaohsiung.

Fueled by the steadfast principles of *Guān Xi* and *Jiān Chi*, Dato' Paul Ha recounts his journey leading a devoted team bound by a shared commitment to excellence. Their dedication illuminated our presence on the international landscape, setting the stage for a narrative of continuous triumphs and transformative achievements.

#### TAIWAN - TELL US HOW IT ALL BEGAN

Back then, within the familiar confines of our home ground, we flourished with a diverse array of local infrastructure projects, from highways to bridges and dams. Although there was no immediate pressure to expand internationally, we were acutely aware that it was imperative to proactively explore new horizons for sustained growth in the long run.

During that period, global interest in MRT projects was burgeoning. When the Kaohsiung Rapid Transit Corporation (KRTC) published the tender notice for the Kaohsiung MRT Metropolitan project, I saw the opportunity and persuaded the management to take a bold step.

Thanks to the encouraging support and trust from Dato' Lin Yun Ling, our group managing director, we took the leap into uncharted territories; it wasn't an easy move, but we embraced the challenge with collective perseverance, guided by the core principle of Jiān Chí. Now, the rest of the success is history.

### THE FIRST STEP: **CHARTERING UNEXPLORED** TERRITORY AND TACKLING THE CHALLENGES

So here's the scoop: when the opportunity to bid for the Kaohsiung MRT project came knocking, there was a catch - we needed MRTrelated experience, and truth to be told, we were pretty green in that department. But we had our aces up expertise, heart and determination. on our sleeves! Although we lacked experience in this field (at that time), our stellar record in completing the construction of highways (which some of it does require tunnelling methods), building bridges and pocketing success in other various engineering projects spoke volumes.

Along with a robust rapport with a local Taiwanese politician, who played a crucial role in trusting our capabilities, we could participate

in the tender. Did you see how the Guān Xì came into rescue?

The first hurdle cleared! We then faced some setbacks in negotiations with several local partners, and our close ties with the local representative turned the tide. It paved the way for a valuable connection, and soon enough, we found ourselves in a strategic joint venture with New Asia Construction & Development Corporation. Other challenges faced during the tender and construction stages include finalising the tender's contractual offers and delayed land handover.

Through unwavering perseverance (that's Jiān Chi) and full support from everyone involved, we finally clinched and successfully delivered our first MRT project - the Kaohsiung Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) Metropolitan Orange Line Package C04, right on schedule.

### THE TAIWAN MAGIC, **LEADING TO CONTINUOUS** PROJECT WINS

Each hurdle we faced in our first project became a stepping stone to greater success.

After completing Kaohsiung MRT, our proficiency in railway development expanded to the successful execution of Malaysia's **Electrified Double Track Project** (Ipoh - Padang Besar). Subsequently, we undertook the construction of our nation's first MRT projects - the MRT Kajang and Putrajaya Lines. So then, we have grown in railway We wanted to diversify and deepen our roots in Taiwan through various meaningful projects.

Between 2019 and 2020, we won three significant projects, including the Marine Bridge - Guantang (and its extension), Seawall - Taipei Port and 161kV Songshu to Guangfeng Underground Transmission Line.

The last 15 months have proved to be another excellent run in Taiwan. We were awarded the RM2.13 billion

In October 2023, we secured the Kaohsiung MRT Metropolitan Yellow Line Civil Engineering, Package YC01, with a contract sum of RM3.45 billion.

### SUCCESS AND **RECOGNITION BY THE** TAIWANESE GOVERNMENT

To date, we proudly stand as the first and only Malaysian engineering company to have entered Taiwan's urban mass rapid transit construction industry.

The Taiwanese government recognised all the environmental efforts and initiatives that we implemented in the Kaohsiung Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) Metropolitan Orange Line Package C04, earning us the prestigious Air Quality Protection Award and National Environmental Protection Outstanding Award 2003.

Our second and subsequent Taiwan projects also made history as we were the sole Malaysian company awarded several prestigious Taiwanese accolades. These include the Excellent

Honour in Construction Golden Safety Award 2022 (for Guantang Marine Bridge in Taoyuan) and Green and Environmentally Friendly Construction Site Excellence Award 2023, Power Transmission Category (for 161kV Songshu to Guangfeng Underground Transmission Line).

These trajectories testify to our demonstrated success and emphasise the enduring trust placed in us by the esteemed Taiwan government, its authorities and the people.

The coveted reputation we've earned through numerous accolades wouldn't be attainable without the collaborative efforts of the entire team, dedicated to achieving success. I can confidently affirm that we effectively maintained our Guān Xì and Jian Chi.

### LOOKING AHEAD. **ASPIRATIONS AND GROWTH IN TAIWAN**

We need to continue harnessing our niche expertise in tunnelling, for which Gamuda is well-known among the Taiwanese. We must always maintain a forward-looking perspective on new ventures and suitable projects.

The profound bonds we cultivate within our team and alongside our Taiwanese counterparts form the bedrock of our success and triumphant journey.

I believe the unyielding Guān Xì and collective Jiān Chí that fuelled us forward in Taiwan thus far will sustain our momentum and bear the torch of Gamuda's regional expansion. We will leave an indelible positive impact on the region's dynamic landscape.

This remarkable achievement of emerging as the first property developer to sweep all three accolades is a truly exceptional hat-trick.

This year's instalment marks the 21st edition of TPDA, maintaining its status as the most eagerly anticipated property developer award in the industry. Results underwent comprehensive evaluation on both qualitative and quantitative grounds, where Deloitte Malaysia conducted a rigorous audit of the scores and rankings. ## Gamuda Wins Third Infrastructure Project in Singapore With the West Coast Station and Tunnels Contract

amuda has clinched yet another project in Singapore to deliver around RM1.77 billion (SGD510 million) for the design and construction of the West Coast Station and Tunnels (known as Contract CR209).

This marks the Group's first independent venture in Singapore without joint venture partners, showcasing our strong delivery track record in the region and solidifying our role as a key player in the city-state's transportation infrastructure development.

This project is our second railway project in Singapore (after Defu Station and Tunnels) and third infrastructure project (after the Gali Batu Multi-Storey Bus Depot), all awarded by the Land Transport Authority (LTA) of Singapore.

Contract CR209's scope of works includes one underground station with twin tunnels at approximately 1.9km. The West Coast Station will be constructed along West Coast Road.

Construction works are expected to kick off in the first guarter of 2024.

CR209 is part of the Cross Island Line Phase 2 (CRL2), the eighth Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) Line in Singapore, boasting 15km and six underground stations. As reported by The Straits Times on 20 September 2023, the alignment for CRL2 will improve the eastern, western and north-eastern parts of the city. Upon completion by 2032, CRL2 will benefit 40,000 households living on Sunset Way and along West Coast Road, which are currently not served by any MRT Line.

- Employs virtual reality for inclusive training, benefitting diverse groups in safety and upskilling.
- Partnered with Australian social enterprise, Empowered Women in Trades in September 2023 to launch a paid training programme.

### Coffs Harbour Bypass: A Year of Progress

2 023 was a big year for the Coffs Harbour Bypass team, stationed on the East Coast of Australia, about a 5-hour drive north of Sydney.

Since the start of major construction works in March 2023, the project team has mobilised a workforce of more than 750 people, finalised detailed design, engaged more than 215 suppliers and subcontractors, completed about 90% of vegetation removal, and about 30% of the bulk earthworks programme. Controlled blasting and bridge building are well underway. Portal preparation has started at the Gatelys Road Tunnel with controlled blasting and 24/7 operations to start in the coming months.

Bring on another big year in 2024!


### Talent Sharing: DT Infrastructure and Gamuda Engineering Australia

### **Ulu Padas Hydroelectric Dam: Vision for A Greener Energy Future**

he Group marked a momentous occasion with the groundbreaking ceremony of the Ulu Padas Hydroelectric Dam in Tenom, Sabah. Graced by prime minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim and Sabah chief minister Datuk Seri Hajiji Noor, the event saw a spectacular turnout of over 1,300 people.

This RM4 billion venture is led by Upper Padas Power Sdn Bhd through a 45-40-15 public-private partnership between Gamuda Berhad, Sabah Energy Corporation Sdn Bhd (SEC) and Kerjaya Kagum Hitech JV Sdn Bhd (KKHJV), respectively.

With a capacity of 187.5 megawatts, Ulu Padas Hydroelectric Dam will contribute 15% of Sabah's energy supply.

On top of contributing to Sabah's electricity grid, the dam is expected to provide 6,000 MLD (million litres per day) of clean and safe water for the people of Sabah - further emphasising sustainable energy and water resources.

Expected to be completed by 2029, the project will invigorate the state's western coastal corridor, sparking socio-economic growth along its pipelines.





### Closing 2023 With **New Milestones in Penang**

he year 2023 has been eventful for the extended Gamuda family in Penang, with the approval and launch of the longawaited Penang's Silicon Island project.

Following the Environment Management Plan (EMP) approval in July, the reclamation of the 2,300-acre Silicon Island undertaken by Silicon Island Development Sdn Bhd and turnkey contractor SRS TC Sdn Bhd has been proceeding smoothly since September. About 1.5ha of land have emerged from the sea, and this tiny bit of land, which is 0.16% of the

entire manmade island. was in the spotlight when Penang's governor Tuan Yang Terutama Tun Ahmad Fuzi Abdul Razak and chief minister Chow Kon Yeow took their first steps on Silicon Island in December.

The event had all the pomp, with the governor and chief minister taking a boat tour to the reclamation site, where they left their handprints in clay to commemorate the milestone.

Other honoured quests - Dato' Dr. Mohamad Abdul Hamid (deputy chief minister 1); Dato Seri S. Sundrarajoo, Zairil Khir

Johari, Wong Hon Wai and Rashidi Zinol (state executive councillors): and Datuk Rosli Isa (state secretary) – also joined them in a tree planting ceremony.

Chow said that seeing the island finally taking shape, he felt gratitude to all parties involved in getting the project approved despite facing many obstacles over the years. He said the Silicon Island project carried Penang's hopes for a better and more resilient future, and he was confident the project, with its key development - the Green Tech Park – would replicate the success of

the Bayan Lepas Free Industrial Zone (FIZ). which made the state a global E&E powerhouse since the 1970s.

"Because of the Bayan

Lepas FIZ, Penang has remained a leading global hub for the E&E industry. However, we must continue improving our industrial competitiveness to ensure Penang remains relevant. Therefore, we need Silicon Island to create more industrial land in Bayan Lepas to ensure the continuous development of our E&E manufacturing sector," he said.

Strategically located near the Bayan Lepas FIZ, Penang International Airport and Sultan Abdul Halim Muadzam Shah Bridge, the Silicon Island is expected to take 15 years to complete.

However. Chow said the completion could be sped up to take only eight to 10 years, with more vessels working on the reclamation starting in 2024.

With two sand vessels operating, 7,000 cubic metres of sand is pumped into the site daily. This will increase to 20,000 cubic metres with four sand vessels working at the site.
